Armistice Day (Remembrance Sunday) had a very good attendance from local groups and




Neighbourhood plan (NP)

This project has been a long-running process which was delayed, in part due to a legislation change, but the Parish Council are now back on track and are close to having a great Neighbourhood Plan in place that should help protect and shape the village in the future. **This is now out for public consultation.**

We would like to invite you to our drop-in meeting at the Royal British Legion on Saturday 27th January 2018 from 10:00 to 13:00 to answer any queries or concerns you have about the proposed **Neighbourhood Plan**. Please bring your feedback forms if you haven't already done so electronically. Your feedback is vital to ensure we have a robust plan.

The plan has been sent to mandatory groups and physical copies are available throughout the village (The Lion, The Travellers' Rest, Verdin Club, Royal British Legion, McColl's, Village Hall, Methodist Church, Moulton caravan park and Moulton School) as well as Bostock Parish Council, Davenham Parish Council and Northwich Library.

The picture on the left shows the many stages the village needs to undertake to make the Neighbourhood Plan an official document that is used by CWAC as a basis for making planning decisions on planning applications. Currently we are at Consultation stage (regulation 14) with some work being undertaken in parallel for the next stage; aiming for completion in May 2018. As you know we have done a village survey and held several meetings to discuss your requirements. The document is a way of portraying your wishes for the village in writing. Northwich's Neighbourhood Plan has just gone to Consolidation stage (November 17); this is very fortunate timing for us aligning our plan with theirs will show that we want similar things to be protected.
